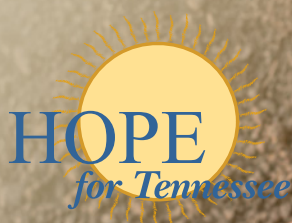


# HOPE for Tennessee



## Who We Serve

Education and prevention services are offered to about 10,000 people annually through street outreach, community events, health and state fairs, and group activities. Information is provided on:

- HIV and other Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD)
- Hepatitis
- Universal Precautions
- Abstinence

## Education

HOPE for Tennessee educators have developed quality educational seminars and workshops on HIV / AIDS, other Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD), Hepatitis, Universal Precautions, and Abstinence. The programs are adaptable for any age group or target population. The programs are free of charge and are appropriate for, but not limited to the following:

- Children of School Age
- Parents and PTA's
- Health Care Facilities
- Colleges and Universities
- Institutionalized Populations
- Church Groups

## Direct Services

HOPE for Tennessee provides case management services for individuals living with HIV or AIDS. Our case managers offer assessments, financial assistance, linkage, and referrals to other community agencies. Case management services are completely confidential. Direct Services are funded through Tennessee Department of Health, Ryan White Title II, and Housing Opportunities for people with AIDS (HOPWA).



## Outreach

HOPE for Tennessee provides free information and on-site HIV and HCV testing. HOPE for Tennessee conducts HIV and HCV rapid testing with results in 20 minutes.

## Our Goal

HOPE for Tennessee is working to help people protect themselves from hepatitis, HIV, and other STD's through education and empowerment.

## How to Protect Yourself

- Abstinence is the only 100 percent way to protect yourself from STD's
- Use latex condoms (rubber), with a water-based lubricant every time you have sex.
- Say NO to Drugs
- If you use drugs, seek treatment
- Don't share needles or drug equipment

## H EALTH

Topics include HIV and other Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD's), Hepatitis, Universal Precautions, Abstinence, Condom Skills, etc.

## O UTREACH

We provide Prevention Services, **FREE** HIV and HCV testing and health information.
